DECISIONS AND RESOLUTIONS OF THE COMMISSION

Eucharistic Doctrine

- (a) The Commission agreed to a Statement on Eucharistic Doctrine which has been submitted to the Pope and the Archbishop of Canterbury with a request for permission for it to be published (with an introduction by the Chairmen). It is hoped that it will be published in Journals such as Theology, The Clergy Review, One in Christ, and will also be available as a separate pamphlet.
- (b) It was agreed that after the Statement on the Eucharist was published, the Venice Sub-Commission on the Eucharist should meet to discuss reactions to it.

(c) The Commission entrusted to the Secretaries the responsibility for the publication of a booklet on Eucharistic Doctrine which would include the Agreed Statement and the background material to it, one item of which would be an English translation of Fr. Jean Tillard's article "Catholique romains et Anglicans: L'Eucharistie".

2. Ministry

The Commission agreed that its next full meeting, 30th August -7th September 1972, should be devoted to the subject of Ministry and would attempt to produce an Agreed Statement on the Ministry similar to the one made on Eucharistic Doctrine this year.

If the remaining preparatory material is sent to the Anglican Secretary by the end of June it can then be distributed to members of the Commission.

Proposed Survey of Anglicans and Roman Catholics 3.

The Commission agreed to make the following recommendation:

"The Anglican/Roman Catholic International Commission recommends to the authorities of both our Churches for their consideration the attached research project. The Commission is satisfied from what it has heard and from specimen projects submitted to it, that the undertaking would be very illuminating and valuable for its work, and could itself contribute to the growing together of Churches, but makes this recommendation subject to satisfactory assurances about the financial aspects and independent expert opinion on the value of the project being offered to the authorities."

4. Sub-Commission on the Theology of Marriage and its application to Mixed Marriages

The Commission recorded its support for the work of this Sub-Commission and recommended that, reconstituted if necessary, it should become a viable instrument for its work. The Commission heard that it was meeting in November, might work regionally in future, and would study existing arrangements by episcopal conferences to implement the Motu Proprio, and would like more precise information about how mixed marriages work out.

5. Publication of A./R.C.I.C. papers

The Commission appointed Bishop Clark and the Anglican Secretary as the nucleus of an editorial committee, with power to co-opt others, for the purpose of exploring the possibility of publishing a volume of A./R.C.I.C. papers.
