I have drafted this programme without the benefit of having attended the last meeting of the steering committee, and using only its minutes, just received.

It is intended to be flexible, having only two broad aims: to include the essential items from the minutes and to minimize the strain on the secretaries.

The lunch-with-guests will be fixed when it has been possible to consult those concerned. At present many people are absent from Rome.

Both Dr. Smythe and I have serious reserves about the proposed Saturday afternoon visit to Rome. The heat will be considerable, few people will be available and traffic delays are likely. A few hours spent in the Alban Hills would be considerably pleasanter and more refreshing. However, we have agreed to make provisional arrangements in case the majority wish to persist with the idea.

Another complication is that the time and manner of an audience with Pope Paul VI (the opportunity for which it would be a pity to forego) cannot at this stage be exactly forecast, and it may be that both audience and excursion will be thought to eat into the commission's time too much.
