ST. GEORGE'S HOUSE
JOINING INSTRUCTIONS

Arrival

A good train service - under an hour - from both Paddington and Waterloo runs to Windsor. Green Line bus services also run to Windsor. London Airport is twenty minutes distant by car.

Both railway stations and the Green Line bus stop are close to the Castle and within ten minutes walk of St. George's House. Taxis are normally available at the railway stations.

Whether arriving on foot or by car, come to the Main (Henry VIII) Gate where the Police will direct visitors to the Galilee Porch Entrance to the Cloisters. Visitors should take their baggage through the Dean's Cloister to St. George's House.

Cars must be parked at the top of Castle Hill, which is reached by leaving the Round Tower on the left and turning sharp right out through a gateway to the top of Castle Hill. (Plan over).

Reception

The Reception Office is inside the front door of St. George's House.

Accommodation

There are 21 bedrooms, of which 9 have 2 beds. (No-one is obliged to share). A few more can sometimes be accommodated in nearby Cloister Houses or the Royal Mews.

The Dining Room can seat 36.

All linen is provided by St. George's House.

Each bedroom has a basin and a plug socket for an electric razor.

Up to 50 can meet in the Chapter Library and two smaller groups of up to 20 can meet in the Common Room and Reading Room of St. George's House.

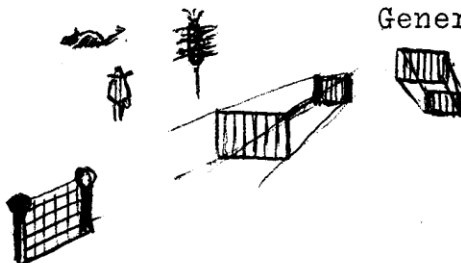
