## WELCOME TO THE COLLOQUIUM OF ARCIC III AND IARCCUM ROME, OCTOBER 5<sup>TH</sup> 2016, 9.00 hrs. FR. NUNO GONÇALVES

Dear Friends,

It is my privilege to welcome you most warmly to the Pontifical Gregorian University today on the occasion of the Fiftieth Anniversary of the founding of the Anglican Centre in Rome. Above all I pray that the God of Jesus Christ, who is the source of all unity, may reward your efforts with abundant success.
